to visit the Caves and Mother Shipton's wishing well. Embarking again, a short run takes us to Harrogate, where we dine and stay the night at the Hotel St. George. After dinner there is time to see something of Harrogate's grandeur. The unique "Stray," a green belt extending for miles, and the Valley Gardens, will appeal to many. Others will wish to see the Royal Baths, Pump Room and Royal Hall.

TUESDAY—After breakfast we set out at 9.30 a.m. A short run brings us to Bolton Bridge, and a short walk across the meadows discloses Bolton Abbey, an historic ruin with its Church adjoining, set in a lovely wooded valley. Crossing the River Wharfe by the stepping stones we notice a stately modern castle, one of the homes of the Duke of Devonshire. The beauty of Wharfedale is very striking as we move in a north westerly direction, and we are soon passing through Skipton. On we journey, and soon reach Settle, where we have a full survey of delightful scenery. We soon arrive at Ingleton for lunch at the Ingleboro' Hotel. A stroll round this quaint town is very pleasing, and a visit to the Ingleton Falls is worth while. The dry stone dykes are much in evidence, and all houses are built of stone. Soon after leaving Ingleton we pass from Yorkshire to Westmorland and passing through Kirkby Lonsdale we reach the pretty little town of Kendal in the Lake District. Soon now a view of Lake Windermere greets us, and we arrive at Riggs Hotel, where we dine and sleep.

WEDNESDAY—At 9.30 a.m. we set out for a whole day among the Lakes, through Ambleside and on to Rydal, where the road skirts the beautiful Rydal Water. A short halt enables tourists to visit Dove Cottage where the Poet Wordsworth resided. A 12 mile ride brings us to Keswick, from where we get a view of Skiddaw, and then on to Bassenthwaite Lake. From the beauty of Bassenthwaite we pass on to Cockermouth *en route* for Buttermere which is one of the loveliest of all the Lakes. Another 14 mile ride brings us to Keswick and lunch at the Royal Oak Hotel. On again to Ullswater, with its charming panorama of Lake and Mountain to Patterdale, where a short halt enables tourists to partake of tea. More and more typical Lake and Mountain scenery delights the eye, as we journey on through Troutbeck to Riggs Hotel at Windermere for dinner and the night.

THURSDAY—Leaving Windermere at 9.30 a.m., we see more of the Lakes, going by Thirlmere, Grasmere, Ambleside, Kendal and Sedbergh to lunch at Hawes (Fountain Hotel). Now a delightful run through Yorkshire and across the Moors via Bainbridge, Aysgarth, Leyburn, Richmond, Bedale, Ripon and Knaresborough to York. The Royal Station Hotel provides our dinner and accommodates us for the night.

FRIDAY—Our last day. At 9.30 a.m. we leave York for Selby, Doncaster, Gainsborough and Lincoln, where lunch is taken at the Saracen's Head Hotel. Then through Sleaford and Peterborough to Cambridge by 6.0 p.m. and Norwich by 8.30 p.m.
